DC National Night Out Invites Eddie!

On Tuesday, August 6, 2024, the Eddie Eagle staff were invited to be at Lansburgh Park in Washington, DC to participate in the DC National Night Out festivities. National Night Out (NNO) is a campaign to promote police and community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie. NNO has been around for 41 years

and has been hosted in 17,000 communities! Most events are held on the first Tuesday in August and this year we were on hand to share our engaging and fun materials and introduce many to Eddie's simple and memorable message of "Stop! Don't Touch. Run Away. Tell a Grown-Up."

Many attendees had never heard of the Eddie Eagle program so staff were happy to help parents, guardians, and local leaders create opportunities to have important conversations about safety with children in a supportive environment.

In addition to the Eddie Eagle Gunsafe Program, National Night Out at Lansburgh Park featured live music, free food, games, and activities for all ages. Local law enforcement and community organizations were also present to build stronger ties with residents and promote neighborhood safety.

Hometown Spotlight - Cleveland Heights, Ohio



Civilians Against Violence, a grassroots organization in Cleveland Heights, Ohio, has been making a significant impact in the fight against violence in the community. Founded by residents committed to creating safer neighborhoods, the organization empowers individuals through education, advocacy, and community engagement. One of their events is an annual "Peace Walk", which brings together residents, local businesses, and law enforcement to march through the streets of Cleveland Heights in a show of solidarity against violence. This event fosters a sense of community and serves as a powerful reminder of the collective responsibility to keep the neighborhood safe. They work to raise awareness about the root causes of violence and provide resources for conflict resolution and prevention.

One of the initiatives they support is the Eddie Eagle Gunsafe Program! One of their members, Demetrius Belcher, says children and adults alike love the "Stop! Don't Touch! Run Away! Tell a Grown-Up!" message, as well as the corresponding dance! He also does presentations at schools and other events in hopes of spreading this lifesaving message to as many community members as possible.

Civilians Against Violence is a vital force in Cleveland Heights, helping to build stronger, more resilient communities through workshops, organizing neighborhood watch groups, and partnering with schools to promote anti-violence education. Their work is a testament to what can be achieved when everyday citizens come together to make a difference.
